2009-12-21 - TRANSCRIPT FOR EXCERPT OF HEARING ON MOTION TO DISMISS

This transcript is of an exchange between Judge William J. Groff and U.S. Attorney Kenneth Perkes prosecuting this case for the State of NH, under the direction of his political bosses, **US Senator Jeanne Shaheen and U.S. Attorney John Kacavas.**

JG: Judge Groff

KP: Assistant US Attorney, Assistant Hillsborough County Attorney and Prosecutor Kenneth Perkes

GB: Gerard Beloin

JG: *Had he. You know. He said he didn't remember it. He forgot about it. He didn't know it was there. Had he remembered and simply showed it to the people and gave it to them there would be no problem.*

KP: *That is correct.*

JG: *Is this? Is this becoming? Are we making something out of nothing here or not?*

KP: *Possibly. Quite possibly. I. I thought on my way down, I wouldn't. It wouldn't hurt my feelings if you dismissed it. But, but by the same token.*

GB: *Your Honor. Dismiss it. I don't want to hurt his feelings.*

JG: *What if somebody else came in here. You think if somebody else besides Mr. Beloin came in here and had a gun and forgot to tell someone, you think the same thing would have happened or not.*

KP: *That's a good question. That's a good question. I don't have an answer to that. I can tell you that of the people that are involved in this case, I may be the least excited about it.*
